**Marriage:** Arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the wedding. A Pre-Cana process is required. Please contact the office.

Th Marriage Tribunal: Deacon Jerry is a trained Case Assistant. Petitioners may speak with him for guidance.

**Baptism**: Baptism is conferred on the third Saturday of every month at 11:00 am or during a regular weekend mass. Parents must be registered and participating parishioners for a minimum of three months. Parents and Godparents must attend a baptism class and submit godparent documents. In order to obtain more information or to schedule a baptism, please contact the office.

**First Reconciliation/First Communion**: School-aged children should enroll in our regular catechetical program. **This is a 2-year program.** Children must have attended a prior year of faith formation.

Confirmation: Children should enroll in our regular catechetical program. Confirmation preparation is a 2-year program.

\*All Sacramental students are required to submit baptism certificate and long form of birth certificate.

#### Anointing of the Sick and Pastoral Visitation





# WARRIORS TO LOURDES: A PILGRIMAGE LIKE NO OTHER May 13-19, 2025

# DONATE TO THE WARRIORS TO LOURDES PILGRIMAGE FUND

The 2025 Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage is sponsored by the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) and the Knights of Columbus. It takes place 13-19 May 2025 in conjunction with the 65<sup>th</sup> annual International Military Pilgrimage (PMI) in Lourdes, France.

The Warriors to Lourdes Pilgrimage allows non-wounded (physical, mental and/or moral injuries), ill or injured US military personnel travel from the Unites States and Europe to the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in France. There, they will participate in PMI events, which include an international opening ceremony, special Masses, visits to the famous healing baths at Lourdes, a Unified Sports Challenge and a candlelight vigil that draws tens of thousands annually.

# About the International Military Pilgrimage (PMI)

During World War II, members of the French military visited the site of St. Bernadette's apparitions, offering prayers for peace. In December of 1944, U.S. military personnel joined British, Belgian, French, and Russian military representatives for a Mass at the Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary. After the War, French soldiers and their chaplains invited German soldiers and their chaplains to gather to pray together. The purpose of this initiative was to heal physical, emotional, and spiritual wounds and to reconcile the past between these former adversaries by recognizing their common identity as Christians in search of peace. The first official PMI was celebrated in 1958—13 years after the war and one-hundred years after the apparitions. Today, the PMI continues to take place for one weekend each May, drawing active-duty members and veterans from over 40 nations.

## **About Lourdes**

Lourdes is one of the most popular Catholic pilgrimage destinations in the world. It was the location of a series of 19th-century apparitions, during which the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared to 14-year-old Bernadette Soubirous. During the past 100 years, millions of pilgrims have flocked to the site, with the hope of receiving a special healing and a deepening of faith.

All expenses for approved non-wounded, wounded, ill or injured military personnel as well as designated caregivers, will be covered by Knights of Columbus Charities, Inc. The AMS-K of C package rate for companions and volunteers traveling from the US to Lourdes is \$3,000 for double occupancy room and \$3,300 for a single occupancy.
