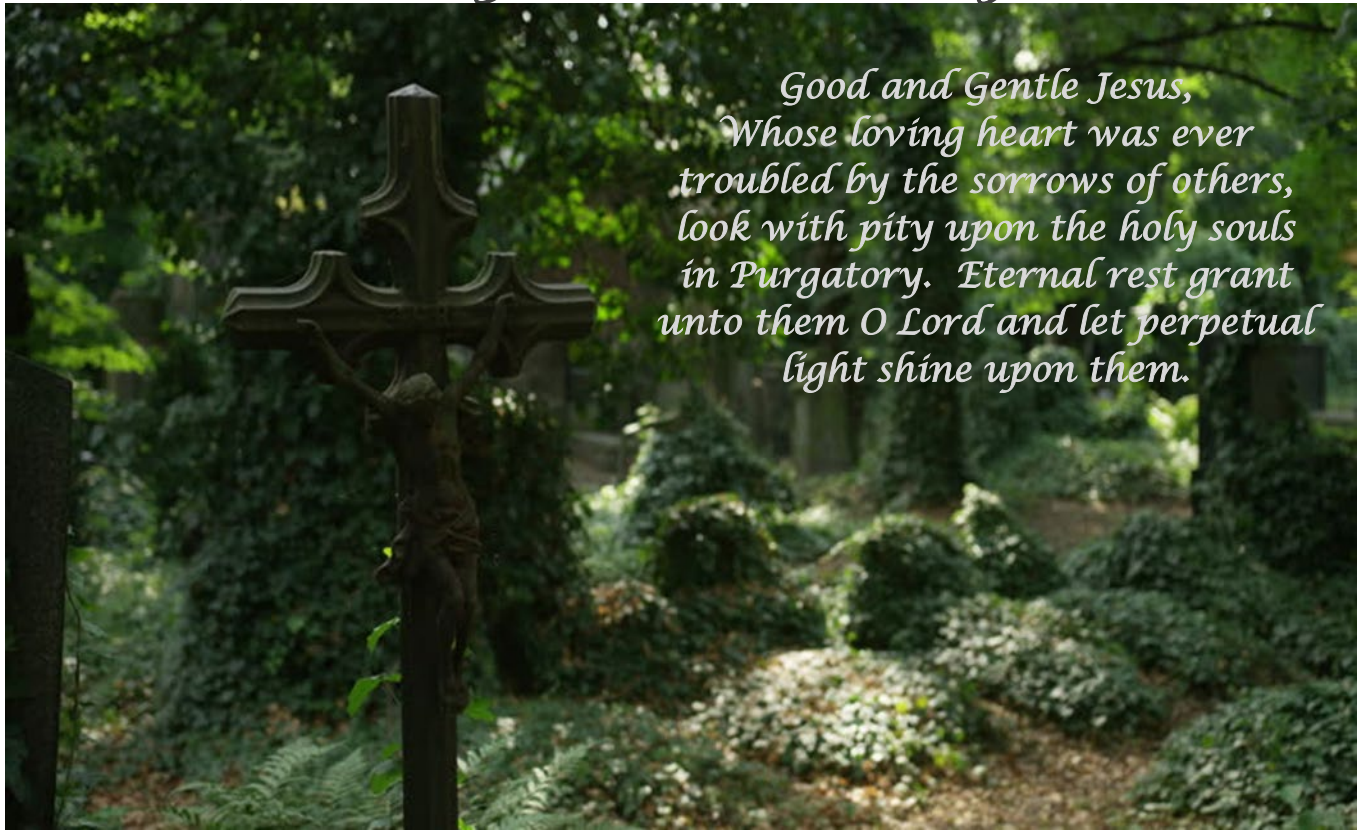

Marriage: Arrangements must be made at least six months prior to the wedding. A Pre-Cana process is required. Please contact the office.

Marriage Tribunal: Deacon Jerry is a trained Case Assistant. Petitioners may speak with him for guidance.

Baptism: Baptism is conferred on the third Saturday of every month at 11:00 am or during a regular weekend mass. Parents must be registered and participating parishioners for a minimum of three months. Parents and Godparents must attend a baptism class and submit godparent documents. In order to obtain more information or to schedule a baptism, please contact the office.

First Reconciliation/First Communion: School-aged children should enroll in our regular catechetical program. **This is a 2-year program.** Children must have attended a prior year of faith formation.

Confirmation: Children should enroll in our regular catechetical program. Confirmation preparation is a 2-year program.

***All Sacramental students are required to submit baptism certificate and long form of birth certificate.**

Anointing of the Sick and Pastoral Visitation

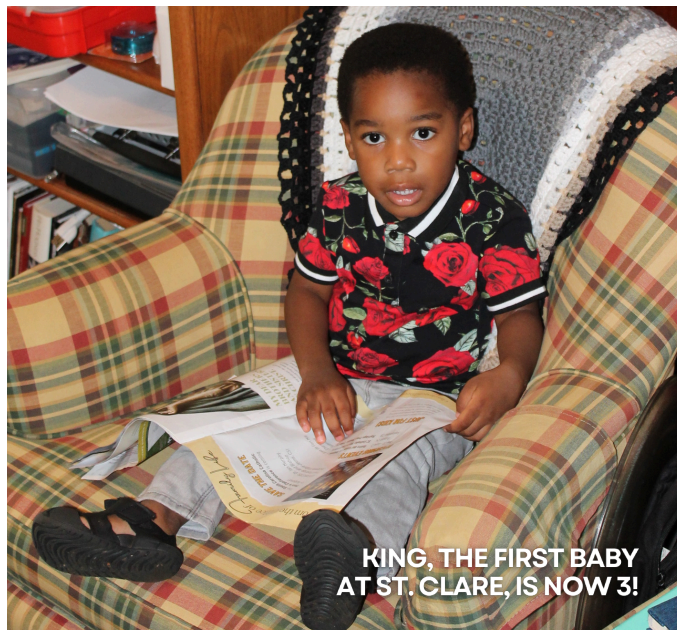
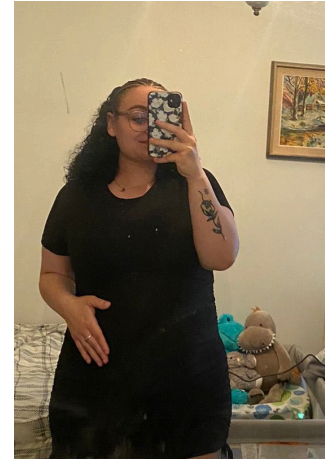
Tori's St. Clare story

I'm Victoria! I am called Tori and am currently in the last trimester of my pregnancy. I moved into the St. Clare Home at eight weeks pregnant. At first, I was nervous and wasn't sure what was to come from being here.

Valerie [Baronkin] and I had been talking about two weeks prior to me moving here. I was living with a roommate and her mom was really difficult. I knew that it was just not a lifestyle I was wanting to bring a child into. I was waiting for what felt like forever, but was only 3-4 days, to find out whether I was going to be able to come. And then Valerie called me and told me I was welcome with open arms to come, and we set up a date and time.

Sister Stella [Mary Okogie] came to pick me up that Friday evening. After being here for some time and realizing how much support I truly have – from people who didn't really know me, but people who accepted me – I realized that God has provided much more for me than I could imagine.

I know we use the term "residents," but we are truly a family, one we didn't know existed until we moved in. I will forever remember St. Clare's as a place that saved me, but also a place that was a home for my son and me.
